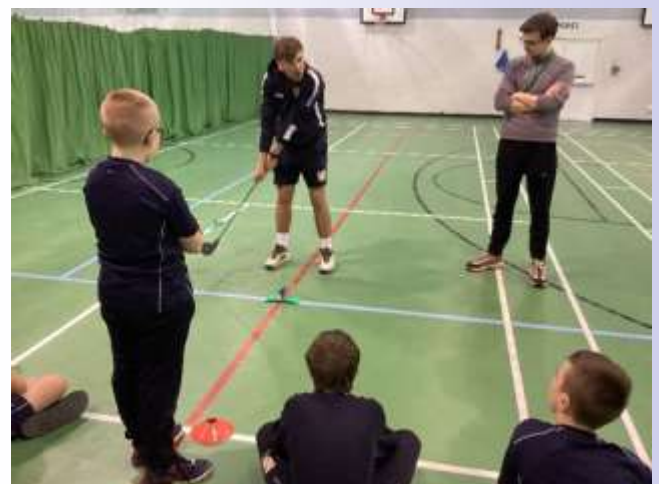
# Clare Mount on the Road to The Open

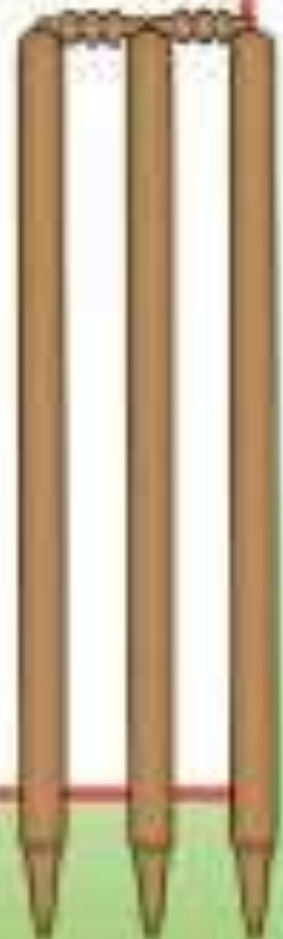
