I want to take this opportunity to congratulate you, Clare Mount Specialist Sports College for your marvellous interpretation of Henry V as part of the Spring 22/23 Shakespeare Schools Festival. It was a great night at the theatre, and I'd like to take this time here to mention a few things that I really loved!

This was a show filled with drama, spectacle and a brilliant amount of stagecraft. Using a combination of epic battles and simple storytelling, you brought the Battle of Agincourt to the stage with a fantastic amount of energy and skill.

Using the whole of your bodies to show the hardship and anguish of the soldiers as they prepared for and then took part in the battle, we went on a real journey with you. When you had marched, we felt your weariness. When you were inspired to fight, we felt your adrenaline rise. It was a real rollercoaster ride!

It was wonderful to see how you divided yourselves into the two camps, English and French. The French accents were something to behold - it was almost like we were in downtown Paris at times! 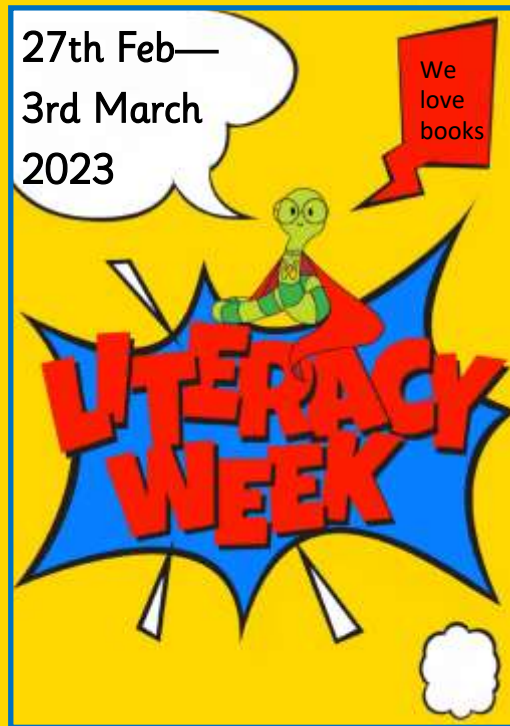
Many students commented on notable performances from the actors and some jaw-dropping staging.

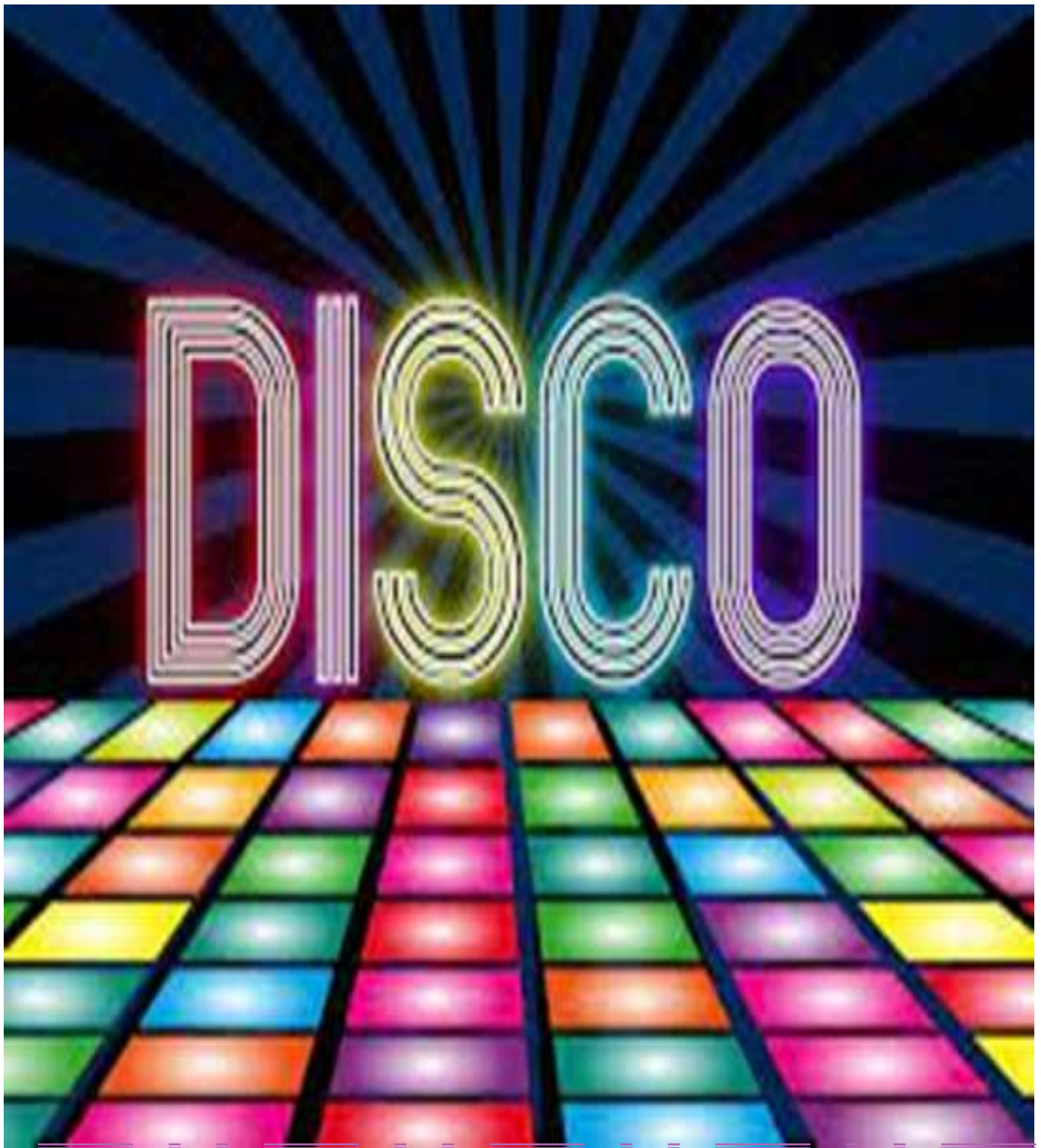


Music

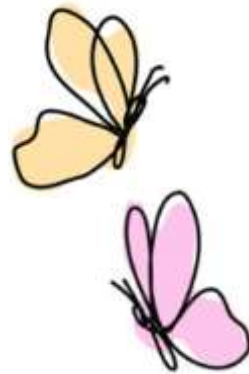


Wildflower Workshop

OPEN SCHOOL FACILITIES (OSF)

Clare Mount has successfully applied to be part of the Merseyside Sport Open School Facilities (OSF) aimed at making our school community more active by opening up facilities beyond the school day.

Clare Mount has secured funding for a range of projects including a SEND Cricket Academy, a Youth Club, Active Fitness and Active Therapy sessions, as well as working with Community Capacity Builders.

With the new school site offering a range of possibilities to access cycle routes we have also worked with Energise Cycles, a local bike charity, to offer bike riding skills, bike maintenance skills, alongside community ride-outs and Dr Bike servicing so bikes are in a fit condition to get people pedalling.

“The Dr Bike scheme is a great idea. Lucas (Year 10) used to ride a lot but has tended to use his scooter more recently. Getting all our bikes serviced by Energise cycles means we can get out cycling again as a family now the weather is getting better” – Mr Jennings.

DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

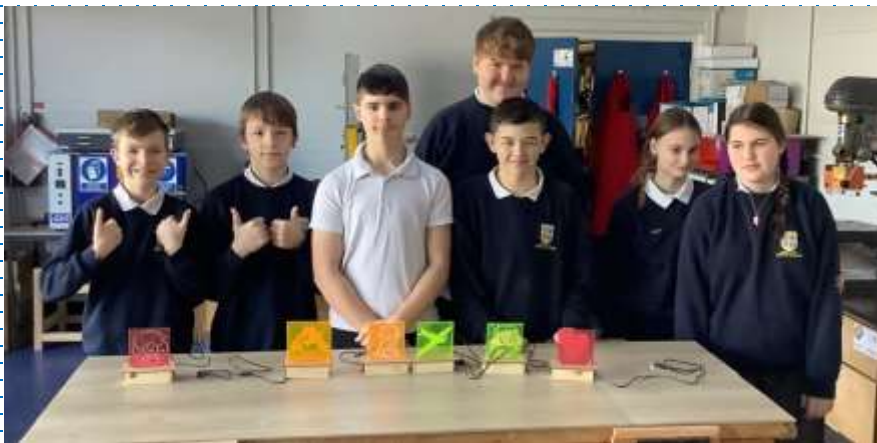

Inclusion 2024 aims to increase and improve opportunities for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) to engage and participate in physical education and school sport.

Clare Mount Specialist Sports College is funded by the Department of Education and the Youth Sport Trust (on behalf of a consortium of organisations including Activity Alliance, the British Paralympic Association, Nasen and Swim England).

Inclusion 2024 works collaboratively with pupils, schools, expert practitioners and local/national partners to drive quality and accessibility of opportunities for SEND pupils to participate, engage and learn through PE and School Sport (PESS).

The programme works to reimagine the role PESS can play for pupils with SEND, reconnect pupils following the negative impact of COVID, and support active recovery of pupils increasing physical health and social wellbeing.

Mr White leads on Inclusion 2024 in Merseyside, and has been working on these projects this year:

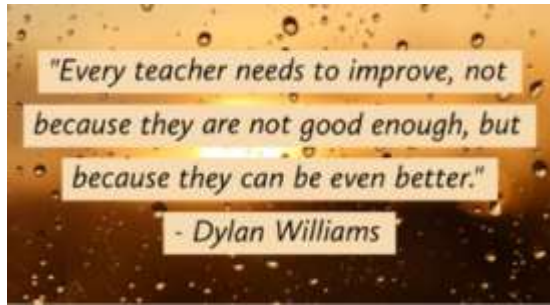
- School swimming and water safety (providing autism friendly resources in the local leisure centres)

ABOUT US ALPACA PARK FARM

My amazing wife Sharon had a cardiac arrest aged 50. From this, she sustained a hypoxic brain injury and for a good few months we were not sure whether she would pull through or not. But she did.

Sharon is not just anybody. She is a Wife, a Mum, a Sister and a Nan to our two little Granddaughters Rosie and Emily.

I built this farm to give her them relationships back. Everything I do is for my family, and I took on the role to rehabilitate Sharon to the best she could physically be. I taught her to walk, speak, think, and love again. Although it was not entirely on my own...I had the help from a few four-legged friends!
