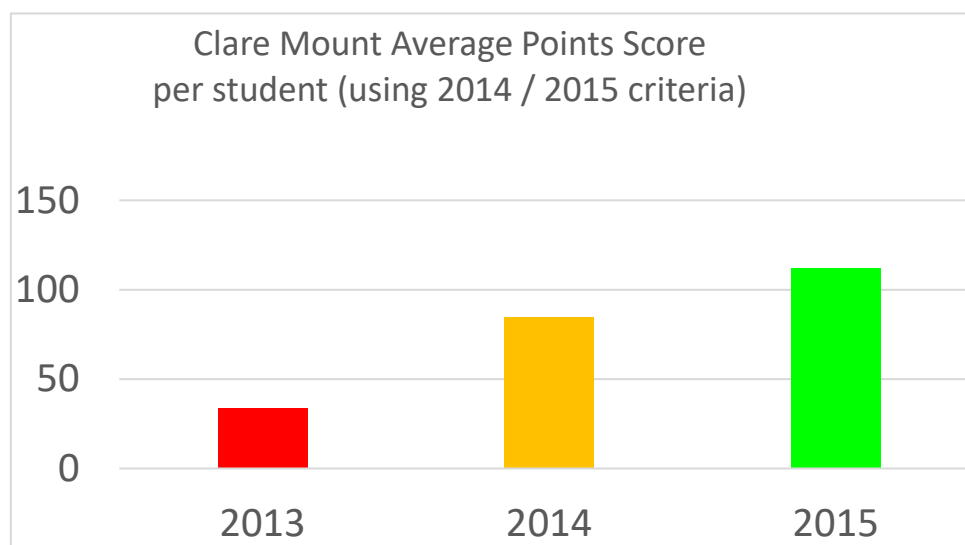
Summer 2015 KS4 Attainment

If we still include points for Entry Level Certificate to enable comparison:

- in 2013, our APS per student was 110.6; in 2014, it was 152.5;
in 2015: 182

However, the progress away from Entry Level Certificate (when appropriate) has been successful:

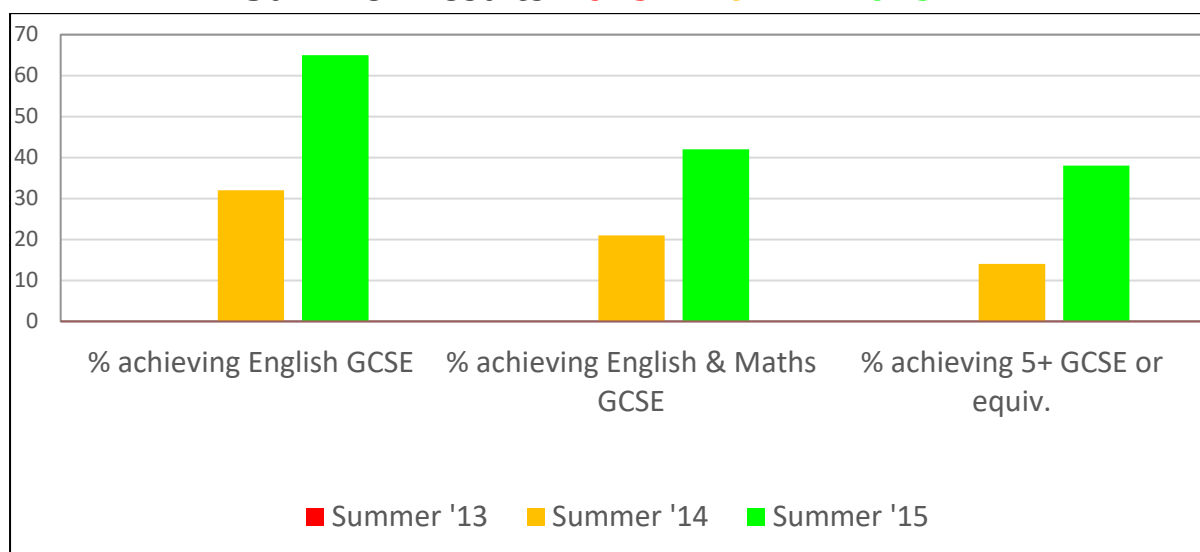
- In 2014: 86% of students achieved at least 1 GCSE;
in 2015: 85%
- In 2014: the average number of GCSE or equivalents achieved was 2.9;
in 2015: 4.6
- In 2014: 14% of all students in Yr 11 achieved 5 or more GCSEs or equivalent;
in 2015: 38%
- In 2014: 32% of all students achieved English GCSE;
in 2015: 65%
- In 2014: 43% students achieved Maths GCSE;
in 2015: 46%
- In 2014: 21% achieved English and Maths GCSE;
in 2015: 42%

Summer 2015 Achievement

- 62% of students achieved nationally expected progress or above in English
(This will not be included in DfE tables as our students were not entered for English Literature).

29% achieved nationally expected progress in English in 2014.

- 12% of students achieved nationally expected progress in Maths.

14% achieved nationally expected progress in Maths in 2014.

Closing the Gap

In English, 6 PP students made better than nationally expected progress - achieving a Grade D GCSE from a starting point of KS2 Level 2; one of these students was a Looked-After Child.

The English Dept. entered 17 students for GCSE (9 students were entered in 2014). More access arrangements were applied for to ensure students could show their true expressive English ability without a literacy barrier (where appropriate).

The Maths Dept. had 9 students achieving Entry Level 3; two of those students tried the GCSE but maybe more should have had that chance. Two students made nationally expected levels of progress – one PP and one non-PP.
